6 SATURDAY [96-269]

Old Lady Day. Oxf. and Camb. Boat Race

Brought up some linen.

Bought from Hejullito parbenuta.

7 SUNDAY—5 in Leat [97-268]

Butchered old cow.

Rained a little.

Glasgow Spring Holiday. 1^h 47^m P.M.

Windy weather. Alfred came back this evening from down south. Been away just one month. Rented camp at Mustolar to Calmar from Boutell. Found every thing all right except an awful lot of water every where. A few cattle dying from mancha etc. expect too much dampness the cause. Picho capataz, finos Climaco & Victorino Gomez here, also Dunlop.

9 TUESDAY [99-266]

Fire Insurance Days of Grace expire

Sent Climaco to Crespas with pack mules to bring Alfredo's baggage. Sent Victorino & Tomas (medicos) to bring horses over for parting and marking. Alfred was up at Caratacas who offered a. a Cartload of maize for the picking. Will also take Tomkins' cows at \$1.00 to do lo que pisa. Alfred also was up at Adolfo's the gunters and arranged to take 400 arrobas of maize at $3\frac{1}{2}$ la arraba. Beastly misty drizzly day and strong south wind set in this evening.

10 WEDNESDAY [100-265]

Alfred and Robson were over at jeans this morning. Victorino & Tomas came back with the horses from over at Morgans. One of the malacara tropilla had died (the zarpito) and 2 are very lame. The horses are not looking very bad. It was a beautiful day but cold clear nights.

Sent all the gent from here and from Puerto to Torres for a load of maize Carabaca gave me for the gathering; stored it below the corridor. Climaco came back from Crespos with Alfredo's luggage and also a bag of biscuits and 1/2 ar. soap from Benjamin's which got wet. also two young greyhounds from down south. It was a beastly disagreeable day no sun. Antonio Lara was here.

12 FRIDAY [102-263]

Butchered an old cow. Sent Carabaca's cart back. Had tuna cut. Murky day.

13 SATURDAY [103-262]

Oxford Hilary Term ends

Hauled two loads tuna from marcacion. Abreu Gomez left for San Pedro. Clear cold day.

14 Palm SUNDAY [104-261]

Pietro, Victorino & Climaco left to part at Brondao also Pedro from Puerto. Took tordillo tropilla &c. Sent cart to Baldomero to bring his family etc. Nothing going on.

O 10^h 19^m P.M.

Baldomero here. Tomas brought load of lucia. Some gent 2 men & woman to work in yerra. Say the rodeo at Mincunado Briondas will be parrared tomorrow. Cold nights fine days. Angel was here, sent word to comisario will mark on Monday if gente come.

16 TUESDAY [106-259]

Alfredo, Baldomero, & Robson left at madrugada to go to Rodeo Mincunado at Briondas but as that rodeo was not 'parado' went to the rodeo del medio where Pichis was parting. Very cold morning but no frost. Baldomero stopped with Pichis to help.

17 WEDNESDAY [107-258]

Hilary Law Sittings end

Alfred & Robson went again this morning and helped part. Parted about 300 but in trying to cross the Espin straight about 30 cleared back so had to end the troop round by Puerto where they sleep tonight. 2 men with horses from Briondas helped, also Don Abreu, and Bernesconi. The rest with our horses were Pichis, Climaco, Victorino, Baldomero, Juan Benavidez & Pedrito. Some troperos also helped to drive the cattle back and are coming to see whether they can't find fat cattle.

Maundy Thursday

Man arrived with the cattle that parted yesterday this morning. Put Torres animals into their camp and marked the calves 77 in all. Gent from Sevidas came this evening, to part tomorrow. Looks very rainy. — Two A cow and calf died in corral. Looks like if had drank too much water. Butchured an old cow. Tropero stops over night. —

19 Good FRIDAY [109-256]

Alphege, Archbp.

It rained a good deal last night so this morning could not parrar rodeo. Parrared east rodeo this afternoon and Sevidas gent sinalara and Torres parted; also Terraspes' gent. The tropero also parted of our reses. He take novillas at 14 1/2 and cows at 13.00. He parted very few this afternoon because it got late. Weather looks bad. Also parted all of Donkins cattle we could find.

20 SATURDAY [110-255]

Put all west rodeo out, and same gent as yesterday parted. Tropero parted about 80 all together tomorrow will recount at Sevidas. Entregand Donkins cattle to Carabaca 132 and 1 we butchured at 6.00 which Carabaca pays when Torres comes. Butchured pd 470. on 1/2 of reses he parted. Bienty Diaz tropero.

21 Easter SUNDAY [111-254]

Alfred & old Juan went down to Sevidas to recount the troop of novillas reses 50 cows & 28 novillos. Tropero pays what he owes in Crespo mayordomas hands or else brings it here 586.00 — Gaspar Duran was here. Sent off the hides 103 by 2 peones from Puerto — Sent them to Carinna for Ricardo Salgado to dispatch to Aldao Santa Fe. Fine day. —

Bank Holiday. (1^h 56^m P.M.

Cart got stuck in cañada yesterday but passed today. Marked east sides today. Parted out calves this forenoon and marked this afternoon 496. A lot of calves left yet. 76 outside men worked. Godoy came this afternoon with 3 more men to help. 8 men worked with their own horses. It was a beautiful day. Men who worked with their own horses were - Fidel Damasia Berneseo, Alonzo Gomez, Puleno, Zellare, Juan, & Fortunato. Butchered an old cow.

23 Easter TUESDAY [113-252]

St. George, M. Cambridge Easter Term begins. Holiday at Law Courts

Put south catch of west sides on; rounded up calves and then drove whole lot to corral. guess about 1000 head. Marked 134 calves - finished by noon. Pleasant day. J. Lemolliere was here. Butchered cow.

24 WEDNESDAY [114-251]

Oxford Easter Term begins

Put west sides on and parted out the calves and marked them in corral this afternoon. Had great work getting across the cañada and about 50 escaped. marked 407 making 1114 marked so far. It was a fine day. Cacique Valentin is here. Butchered vaca con cuero.

Ampland with gent of marceacion. danced nearly all last night, and most of them left today. Alfredo was up at Carabacas to see about cart of Pedro Larn which he buys at \$55.00. Warm day but a very cold nights.

26 FRIDAY [116-249]

Alfred & Cacique Valentin went out as far as Cañada Nutria to see how the road is to drive cattle but found that it would be impossible to march as there is too much water. Butchered a novillo, and staked out hide for pelota. Drizzled some this afternoon. Cut down canes in garden to take outside.

27 SATURDAY [117-248]

Godoy and his 3 men left this morning until wanted to drive cattle. Paid them \$25.00 for marceacion and also to indemnify them for their trip for nothing. It was a murky day. Sent Olimaco up to Loba to Morgans to bring the two black redomons and also the horse of Donkins left by Jack Heart, also sent word to Gaspar Duran not to come. 28 Low SUNDAY [118-247] with gent to march.

Tropero Zubillas was here. Pleasant day. Young saw-boy Randal came today.

Put east sides on in fog and marked 65 calves of ours and 4 of Donkins. A lot of gente turned up. Made a disparrama of gente afterwards. Marked Donkins colts afterwards 8 females and 7 machos and 2 of ours = 1 male, 1 female. Beautiful day. R. Morgan and Dick Griffiths were here on a passed. Gave them all old trading matter. Gilby also turned up by way of Colorado.

30 TUESDAY [120-245]

Easter Law Sittings begin. ● 2^h 5^m A.M.

Put cattle of west side on sides and marked 161 calves making 1340 marked so far. Just our gente worked and a few outsiders helped. But turned an old cow. thin.

1 May WEDNESDAY [121-244]

St. Philip and St. James, Ap. & M.
Royal Academy opens. Turk. Month
Ramadan commences

Brought up the mares from Rinconada and ~~marked~~ ^{marked} and the colts. 10 machos and 13 hembras. and ~~considered~~ ^{expended} 42 mares & potrancas. Left mares in this camp. Lazaro came and pd 25.00 to my wife at pulperia - of the 50.00 he owed me more than a year. Pleasant day.

St. Athanasius.

Dunlop left this morning. Peones desgranared
maiz this morning. Jung Levi and female
passed tonight on way to Estancia.

3 FRIDAY [123-242]

Invention of the Cross

Butchered old cow. Misty day. Nothing going on.
Robson & Cylitty were hunting.

4 SATURDAY [124-241]

St. Monica

Men desgranared maiz this forenoon. Last came
from Escalada station 14 days trip - cost \$15.00 wages
2.00 gastos - left horse sick at Crepas. Alfredo was up
at Karabacas. Got 40 cartridges.

5 SUNDAY - 2 aft Easter [125-240]

Getting ready to go outside, but afraid cant start
tomorrow on account of scarcity of men. Parted at
Lorres rodeo - about 15. Got quintal wire from Lorres
and a bag potatoes.

St. John, Evan. ante. Port. Lat.
Bank Holiday, Scotland

Butchered a cow. The tropero who parted here last Vicente Diaz came - paid up, and wants to part more. Butchers from new station were also here - promised to let them ^{have} cows at 12½ and steers at 14½. Getting ready to start out. Looks murky and rainy. Fellows that were hanging round gone up to Luis marcacion. Huntared open and horses to go outside.

7 TUESDAY [197-238]

Very heavy fog this morning. afterwards put east rodeo on and the butcher Vicente Diaz parted. later on had west rodeo where he also parted until late. parted about 50 novillas + cows. will count in the morning at puerto.

8 WEDNESDAY [198-237]

10 6^h 43^m A.M.

Alfredo went over to puerto and counted the troop sold to Vicente Diaz 30 novillas of ours at \$14.50, 1 of Donkeys and 42 cows at \$13.00. making a total of \$850.00 which he deposits in my name in Provincial Bank Santa Fe. He leaves receipt for troop at Chapuis. Gave certified on San Justo. Gave Don Hipolit Trumolliere \$500. to keep for me. also reglared my ac. so owe no one except old Felipe at San Pedro and will pay him when I get money for lides sent to Barraca Aldao. Weather beastly misty. Loaded cart to go out to Mistolar tomorrow.

Alfred & party came back from the Calchaqui today. The river was so high could not cross it. Had left here on the 9th - were 2 1/2 days in Torres camp outside with open tent. 2 moullos taken along to butcher could not be found, one escaped with 2 lassos. Alfred, Agilby Nelson Randall Zepriano, Pedro, Valentin Caeique, Ignacio, & Juan Antonio were of the party, and ^{4 left Sept. 1888} paid each 6.00 for their 10 days work. The roads pretty bad yet. Came back from camp this side of Calchaqui in 2 1/2 days with cart, left there the canes, quintal wire and demijohn. Here had gone to Troncos and signaled about 20 calves as they were going to mark. Delivered also 19 cows to Eusebio ^{237.50} Saavedra of the station at 12 1/2. Money to be delivered to pulper at Capatzen. Weather drizzly for last few days. Some men from Reconquista came to help take cattle outside rather ahead of time.

18 SATURDAY [138-227]

19 SUNDAY - 4 aft Easter [139-226]

St. Dunstan, A.C.

Fixing up things from trip. Gent from Reconquista gone to work at Torres marcacion. Cold weather. Nothing going on.

Alfred & Gilby went to station and visited the engineers Phoenix and Ranol, and also borrowed \$200.00 from Carnicero on ac of 19 cows at 12 1/2 which he took last week. (237.50). Randall left for Cochudas - he owes \$2.00 on ac Poncho he bought. It was a fine day. Men that were working at marcacion Erondas came back today pretty tight. Butchered an old cow. hide for Lasso.

1349 Marked 9 tambora calves at puesto. 1349 so far. Sold 5 out of the 8 morillas the Basco Manuel is turning to him for 100.00. He pays in the money to pulperia at station of Cayetano Capato.

21 TUESDAY [141-224]

C 9^h 53^m P.M.

Alfredo was down at Chapuis. It was a very pleasant day. Nothing going on. Drew my \$500. from Don Leopoldo.

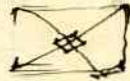
22 WEDNESDAY [142-223]

Sent cart up to quintero of Serris and received the maize 25 bags 136 arrabaz @ 40 the ar. Troop of 240 cows of Juan Gony stops the night. Raining. Alfred goes to Goya tomorrow to bring horses over, with Jose the moreno (Ramayous' son)
