


that we were going up to Resistencia.

Resistencia, went to Van Wyk dentist who x-rayed
my mouth & did various scrapings which im-
proved my teeth. Had lunch at club and bridge
with Middleton, Higginson & Ainsworth bet \$5.-

Took the train 4⁴⁵ P.M. French station with Willie
luckily the weather had turned cooler & wind steady.

15 Home Europe

Resistencia. Arrived here 8 P.M. had dinner
Met at Juliana's Mr Miller secretary who
said had been at El Rincón this summer. -
Also traveled with the head keeper of Foresta
as far as Colorado. Traveled with a

man with a Dodge to take us to
Campo Winter for \$130. baggage.
Warm balmy day. Roads supposed
to be good. Say had auto back to
Zapallar & back lost Sunday in 5
hours.

Campo Winter - 16 - pleasant warm day.
Left Resistencia at 7:30 am. as had to
await coffee. Very sleepy place.

Roads dry but rough & Dodge rather
too low on ground. Got to Guaycuren river
in 2 hours 10 minutes, & arrived at
Zapallar 2 P.M. Had a snack of bread
& ham in front of Fernandez house.

Saw Aencar & Shultz at Zapallar.
arrived at Campo Winter at 3:15.
Things look dry but catch steam all
night. Car went back to Resistencia
after paying \$130. quite worth it, but
guess a lighter higher car would
have been better.

July 1927

Campo Winter - 17 - warm balmy day.
In morning motored to Asuncion with
Willie and Judy. Bought 32 mt. of
of tramante to cover car @ 75¢ mt.
Also a box of fancy Paraguayan cigars
for \$9.25. In afternoon Willie & I
motored to Estancia La Terripa & had
tea with Hercules & family who were
playing tennis. There were Juan Yoris
Mendizabal, another young chap & an
old man friend. Photographed the house
(nice wonder house) Peones caught
a tatu and a mulita.

18

Campo Winter. Warm day & wind
clouding over in evening.
Roced (in corral) was put on in
Envernada pateros, about 1300 head.
arrived about 3:00 big 4 yr novillo -
Mendizabal, Hardy & another
chap turned up & received the novillo.
Traded with Mendizabal ship of Leo
Cemeros 450 novillo @ \$50 to be
taken by 1 month's time or before

July 1927

A glipio. In afternoon had on
roads towards Tempejo Co. about 1400.
Reconna knows east side with
Willie + Lucky. Camp looks dry
but cattle in good condition
considering they had a short
drought a few months ago. - Peons had caught
a couple of melinita + tate yesterday.
Ought to keep some more manes.
Couch grass seems to be coming in
which would do the camp a lot of
good. -

Celestia — 19^{30°} Tuesday.
Left this morning about 7¹⁵ + went
to revise the Sombrito camp next to
east gate, then to point of Celestia
finally return to lag Sombrito
which has plenty of water. See some
aguas catch in camp which is
very pastoso + looks good camp +
only mountain on south side. Reconna
suggested Lucky to divide the camp
in half, about at Punta

19 K to west gate of Sombrito camp
2.6 " E gate of Sombrito camp
2.7 " point of Celestia
6.7 " Sombrito Lake. -

In afternoon Willie + Lucky went
to Zapallar to see if any telegrams +

Co. estancia. Making preparations to leave
tomorrow for Puerto Tempejo + home. -

Hot north wind 30° below normal. -
Told Lucky would give 10- for the giant
cane roots to plant here, to be found in
Rafel's camp.

Wednesday 20 — Strong north wind hot.
Puerto Tempejo — Hotel Progreso. -
Left Estancia Camps Winters about 7 am
& arrived 2³⁰ PM here. Lucky driving car
roads rough in parts, between ^{estancia} Expedition
& this side of Gandolfi. Stopped at Arica
about 9³⁰ to see if any one was there
to show us catch for sale. about 3/4 hour
distances: 65²⁰⁰ to Arica from Celestia
78 mon to P. Tempejo, last about 7 Kil on
road, making 136^{amt.} K from C. Winters
27.2 leagues

- July 1927 -

Poor hotel (Progress). Saw Circa who is ill & wants to get away. Costs \$200 to pick ^{50 or 60} from his bulls (234 2 yr up) & wants \$80. for all of his cattle comprising of more or less 1300 head (234 bulls 2 yr up 100 yearlings) & 66 cows & many yearlings, etc. Will see about receiving tomorrow. Saw Circa & Santos who were very attentive. Sent telegram to B.B. to await us on Sunday. Steamer going down tomorrow night. (Lambore)
Went to Belvedere with Jerry & Ray:

Ray & Willie manager of street factory.
S.B. as pilot.

S.B. Lambore - 21 Thursday. Hot day. Wind, town full of dust.

Trucking left for Civieta. Willie went with him as far as Circa (15 hours) to receive the catch & come back with Ray & Jerry. 6:50 P.M. Went to see Circa & traded for 200 picked cows & heifers @ \$1.00 and 50 bulls at \$165. To be picked from all his cattle. Wrote to Trucking to take the catch away as soon as he can. I have copy of letter. Left at 11 P.M. on Lambore

for Razonia, (cabin 39) only one cabin as the purser says steamer is full. Before getting on board went to Belvedere where saw Cozchi, Barrington, Santos and dancing going on. Quite a place! (S.B. Cozchi offered to do anything up here. Ray & Jerry seem a very decent chap.

S.B. Lambore - 22 - Friday, -

In morning about 7 we stopped a bit at Corrientes & guess will get to Goya about 8 P.M. Wind had changed to strong south looks as if temporal. Not much going on, on board which seems very full. Saw Americans on board interested in tobacco growing. - Injoke at Goya Mr. Walker & Francis got on board & we played bridge, won \$6. -

Saturday, -
Cold & wind 23 - Clear breezy day, all day on board Lambore and arrive at Razonia 10 P.M. went to Palace Hotel. Played bridge good deal today with Walker & Won \$2 -
Steamer gradually got full up & at about 3 hours later, saw Van Dusen & other Americans at table & had drinks

Sunday 24 - Frost + N wind.
Left Resaca 6:20 train for L Resas.
Young Astengo + Suarez were on board
also Dorando. - Same all well.
Miss Colville Jones + Norman Clark are
stopping here, also Sykes Geo Middleton
Tracy, Scherly, + C. Leburn. -

1928 August

Aug 14th Tuesday. Left Resaca with Jim
Bell 5:15 P.M. for Chaco. - Pastern was
on train

15
Wednesday - Hotel Europa Resistencia.
Reached Resistencia 8 P.M. quite a
good journey. Only saw Santiago Carran
on train. They say roads are very
bad to Zapallar. Will await Godoy
who does the trips to Zapallar + is returning
tomorrow from there. Lots of water on sides
of R.R. Big reman of cattle at
Fini' lla today.

16
Thursday. Hotel Europa Resistencia.
Called on at Guearte, Ancar + Dr
Winkler but none were at home.
After lunch motored to Barranqueros
+ back to see progress. Making a fine
road to cut thru. Arranged with
Godoy to take us to Campamento
for \$150. tomorrow + a cart driver
for Alberto Celmeri who is the driver of
Ford. Saw Tracy Walker a guest of Ford.
Went to cinema at night. El Gaucho.
Also had drinks at Samy Hotel. ^{Very fine} Hotel.

August 1928

Friday. — 17 — Fine warm day.

Hotel Medina, Zapallar.

After buying a few provisions + a rape left for Zapallar at 8 AM arriving here at 8:15 PM very bad road, about 25

leagues of mud. 3 cars went together: Quisay with a lady dentist + a Aliaga with a married daughter + children.

Lunched (picnic) at Zapallar + about 10 leagues from here met Garricochi + Jimmy of Swifts who were stranded.

— 18 —

Saturday, Campo Winter 29° hot day.

After breakfast left Zapallar for here.

Roads quit dry. Alberto Almon (Brown bob Resistencia) brought us all the way.

Everything looks well + lots of chacra work being done. Rhodes grass seems to be a success. Pattered around the place in afternoon on foot, + in morning we went with Tecky to the port, where a steamer + chota were being unloaded.

+ expecting to go down on Wednesday.

— 19 —

Sunday, Campo Winter 28° nice day, East wind. In morning looked like rain but cleared off. In morning brought up cattle from enramada potrero about 800 head: about 550 mules of all ages and about 200 Lirico cows looking quit well. Marked my cattle 18 hembras 12 machos 2 mules. After siesta called on at Cien Verdujo estancia + had tea with Mr + Mrs Armitage. Said house had cost 38000. Seemed to have trouble finding water. Meakin was there also. —

Monday, Campo Winter 29°

Fine forenoon + hot afternoon. Getting cloudy. Had on rodeo east side about 1000 head, looking well. Leftwards rode to Alderete Tapera. If rain comes grass would be finer. Looking into accounts!

Aug 21 - 1928

Campo Winkli. Tuesday Hot day 30^{1/2}
Motona to Sombrito with Tucky &
Bell. Rodew was on then to part some
sarnosas to dip here. Went to Laguna
Media Luna; total then & back here 65 K.
Sent to Zapallar to see if Godoy is going
down to Resistencia. Celestino Gonzalez
is in charge of Sombrito camp.
No news of Godoy. Tely from home saying
I balls & ram had arrived.

22

wednesday

Campo Winkli 27° not so warm

Motona with Bell & Tucky to Zapallar to
see about going down to Resistencia to-
morrow. Rec'd telegram from Albert Almeri
saying he was leaving Resistencia today.
In afternoon Ward of Aeroay camp bought
about 100 animals to dip also the ones from
Sombrito. He stays the night.

Tucky signed conforme to his account
to 15/8.

Aug 23

Thursday. Hote Europa, Resistencia
Warm day. Tucky motored Jim & I
to Zapallar at 5 am & found Alberto
Almeri awaiting us with broken car, but
managed to fix it up & left about 11 am.
Roads very bad still. Were pulled out of
pantano at Payanti. Arrived here 7 P.M.
lunched at bolicho Fernandez. At
Zapallar we met Miller of Rampa del
Indio also son of Feliciano Ramirez.

24

Friday. On train for Rosario

left 5:50 am Resistencia. 4c of Hote Europa
was not made but so did not pay it;
will send cheque. Train & 3 daughters
met us at Calchagua. Gam Jim Bell
cheque for \$1000.- for trip. He said he
would go up any time if necessary.
Warm day for travelling.

1929.

July 18th

Yesterday evening after a warm muggy day changed to sunset & a few drops of rain and I + looks as if going to be a cold dry spell.

Left with tykes to C. & G. after lunch & caught the 1st train to Resurrección, & then took the 5th train to Resistencia. B. & W. had dressed themselves in their new canvas clothes.

19

Hotel Sany Resistencia, Cold day & wind. Arrived at Resistencia at 7⁵⁰ P.M. Tried to find information re road to Zapallar.

Had rained a lot as lots of water along side of R.R. Estancia of Los Valerios was on train. Played polo with tykes.

20

Hotel Sany, Resistencia. Cold day & wind over cast but cleared up by night. - Saw Gemenez, the car owner who took us to Curitiba with OB 1924 & he promised to take us out & back by Thursday for \$170, also taking us about there

free. Went to Phalff saddle & bought a meado for 92.00 complete & cast sheep skin. Also went to Nacion bank & got a giro on Asuncion for 1000.00. Commission 6.75 in case we need it. In afternoon motored to Baranqueros & got timetable of Steamers from Misiones a journey. Later we went to Cinema Volga Volga quite good, quite full. Lot of oranges at Hotel tonight as there is a dance at Social Club.

- 21 -

Campo Wintin. Cleared up & was a fine day. Left with Gemenez in his Reilly at 7³⁰ A.M. & arrived at Zapallar 150 Kil at 4 P.M. & then to Campo Wintin at 5 P.M. 25 Kil. Had fruit for lunch & lunch at a tubiche about 50 K from Zapallar. Mr Hamilton was away at Estancia C. Gemenez in the Camion & we sent for him to bring a bed which was short of here. Had 111 m.p.m. rain on the 9th & camp & catch looking well.

July 22 1929

Campo Viejo, lovely day E wind
slight, went with Hamilton & Sykes
in morning to the Port & called on
Ayala. Said freight from Zapallar to
Resistencia was \$110 for trip both
ways in dry time, otherwise 140.

Attn at Estancia gave about 2 tons to
Lactaria but costs 10 cts kilo to
gather - Price not very high nor
low. Rained only 58^{mm} at Port
from^{1st} May last year to end of May
this year had rained 1070^{mm}.

After Seisla we motored to the new
well in Sembrerito camp & back 4^{to}
kil. Stopped at Campo Arcoay &
saw Ward asking if he knew
address of Mrs Arcoay as heard camp
was for sale.

July 23

Fine day, Campo Viejo, fine cold
day. Went with the hired auto to the
Vermejo Co Estancia & then from there to
the Hardy's Obraje in Vermejo Co Estancia.
Saw Paton who is the timber weigher.
As going away from Obraje met Hardy
and asked for prices for fresh 4x4 3rd
varilla 140 M and tablones 2".

Lots of timber there about 5000 tons. For
Lopagho they pay 6 per ton to the Vermejo
Co Estancia. Had lunch with Armistep
41 kil to Obraje & back here.

After tea went with Cañion, Sykes, Ham-
ilton & myself to Rio Oro toward pass
& explored the mouth. Heard Monkeys.
Getting ready to get an early start
tomorrow for Resistencia.

Hotel B Aires Corrientes

Wednesday

July 24th 1929

Fine day, fresh & chilly.

Sykes & I left for Resistencia 5³⁰ AM with the car of Germany, and as roads were dry arrived at Resistencia 1 PM. 2 1/2 hours ride from Curitiba. Wrote to Higham re: Arany camp & that would pay 20 hectares. Left for Corrientes from Barrapiemas 4⁴⁵ PM & was told steamer leaving for Posadas was going full tonight, so have to stop here tonight & decide tomorrow what to do.

25

On train to Posadas. Thursday. Coldish but east day. Telegraphed first thing to Posadas & reserved beds to Synago on steamer which leaves Saturday.

Called on Wenceslao Ward who was very attentive today at station & helped us in reserving berths for tonight. After lunch we went to the Innis Club where we met Ward, Miss Mendonca who is head of the club, she met Orland then & others had tea, quite a social gathering. Ward had dinner with us, & had cocktails with King Park & Taylor. Took 10 PM train for

Posadas going by Caseros return up. Ward seems an enterprising chap.

Friday, on train to Posadas. Rained all last night & today. We arrived at Mendo Caseros about 10 AM & left on main line to Posadas at about 4 P.M. Had lunch at a hotel & had a look at the Uruguay river. Set in Taylor's private coach until we got to Mendo Caseros. Miss was on train to Posadas also a Mrs. — who was a Knight, was on train & had dinner together. Camps very sudden with water. Pretty as a picture. A nice country to look at. Seems a large English element at growing yerba and fruit trees.

“Columba”
July 27th Saturday.

Saturday. Rained last night nearly all night & some this morning & rest fine day. Arrived in Posadas about 4 AM, went to Mihanovich office & then on board “Columba” for Synago. Got a cabin, Sykes & I and a Barn & Kullerby. Steamer full. Sun

Americans besides Mr & Mrs Bradley & Miss & Green, Miss Birch & Miss Bietel on board & all not in a comfortable hand some bridge at night. Quite a good steam, food but not extra. Say river is 35 to 35 mile deep. Toledo fishing best in Sept.

28

Piquiza falls. ~~Saturday~~ ^{Sunday} Rained some in morning, early on boat, but turned out to be a fine day. Reached Puerto Aguirre at 2 P.M. and as we were about 80 passengers had trouble in getting to the falls, about 60 minutes. We got an outside room in the Army rather poor. I arrived in last car at 8 P.M. Great crowd here & very good spirits.

29

^{Monday}

Iquiza falls. ~~Sunday~~ ^{Monday} Warm muggy day, looks like rain. Our party of 8 went in car about a league & then in a canoe to the Garganta del Diablo (the biggest fall) very fine. In afternoon

walked with a big party to see the river & falls nearest here. About 82 guests all together here in hotel. - very crowded & was room No 4 in Annex only has two beds & a chair & have to come across for a wash etc.

30

Iquiza falls. ~~Monday~~ ^{Tuesday} ~~Damp muggy~~ ^{trama some} day. In morning at 9 am went with big party on foot to see the falls from below. I think the San Martin falls. Very slippery & lots of climbing. In afternoon did not go out as it rained. Had some bridge. Cinema in hotel in evening. - Bought some post cards.

Iquiza Falls. ~~Wednesday~~ ^{Wednesday} Cold overcast day disagreeable. The party who were stopping here left by the "Corumbá" again for Posadas, including our American friends: Mrs & Mrs Glen Bradley, Miss Green, Miss Birch, Miss Bietel & Mr Nielsen. Ayler & I are

first in motor car to cause + then
across in canoe. A Guano family is
there. Best view of falls is there.
Got some black tobacco there. In after-
noon had a short walk.

Aug 2 — Fresh + overcast
Friday, Puerto Aguirre. Left the Iquiza
falls at 9 am, arriving here 10 am
18 hrs. The chocolate maker Saenz wife
+ child, came along as they had a
private steamer (Cicada de Pucallpa)
as the steamer "Stuzzingo" which is to
take us to Mandy (should have been there
+ easy) has not arrived have to stop

the night. However this is quite a good
Hotel, but we are losing time. Guess
something must have happened to the
"Stuzzingo". Saw a wire less telegram
to Henry saying we would be back here
in 4 days + he send a telegram here if
"wounded".

Saturday, Hotel Iquiza, Aguirre.
Beautiful day, but cold morning
+ very cold tonight. Guess about freez-
ing. Heard today by Radio that
steamer "Iquiza" "Stuzzingo" had run
against something + had to return to
Eldorado, + that the "Concomba" was on
way up. Don't know when we will be
able to get to Mandy. — Stralled about in
morning + in afternoon went in a canoe
to Brazilian side of falls but had to come
back as too hard walking in boots.
Tiger skin offered for sale for \$50.

1929

Aug 4. Sunday

Hotel Iguayo Aguirre. -

Another fine day, but cold nights. -
Went at 4:30 in a rowboat to Pozo del
Iguazu taking 2 hours as there
were some rapids. Went to Hotel
International & had quite a good
lunch. Met Mr. Wainwright, then
Am. Consul in way from San Paulo to
Ctyraquirit via Baim. We took a
cañon & had a short drive to see
a small yerba plantation. It can
be seen in 1/4 hour. Wainwright
came with us. Had tea from
Floury Day, very dry & cold. Steam
Circuito & trucked through from
Poades. - (Did not come)

Sunday. Aug 5 - Monday. Olding
Hotel Iguayo Puerto Aguirre. The steamer
Circuito arrived about 11 o'clock & leaves
again Wednesday 4 P.M. Boat about
40 passengers, who left for the falls.
Boat papers from 23 to 30 July, which
we borrowed. Not much doing today.

Aug 6 -

Tuesday. Hotel Iguayo Aguirre

Another fine day warm. -
Sykes, Wainwright & I went in a canoe
with the bolero & 3 Navy cadets down
the Parana river to a port called
Geminny where the tract a beautiful
plantation of all sort of trees of fruits
& yerba. a regular park. We saw
them picking yerba. We each got about
a kilo, but wants grinding yet.
Also from there walked about 2 Kil
to Bertoni place, quite interesting
also. Beautiful forest. Took us
1 hour to go & 3 hours to come
back. Mrs Geminny says they have
about 200 classes of citrus
plants. The place was well worth
while. Some trouble in getting back
over the rapids or "corredores".

1929

Aug 7 - Wednesday

Vapor Corumbá. Fine day, steamer.
We went on board, after lunch & after
the tourists from the contract returned
we left at 2 P.M. About 40
passengers on board. We tied up at
El Douro for the night as the capt.
wants to be careful after the accident
to the "Styano's" last week. Very
nice on river & slipping at good
many places for passengers etc.

8 - Thursday

Hotel Palace Posadas.
Fine day. Light fog in morning,
but sun left, fog off & arrived
here about 5 P.M. Quite a
large Hotel. We had dinner
together with Minnie & then
saw him off on train to B.A.
Went to a cinema afterwards
"Go Day Culpable"

Aug 9 - Friday

Palace Hotel, Posadas. Warm windy N.
Got a car at 50. to take us to ruins of
San Ignacio taking 2 1/2 hours to get
there. Pay about 25 but had been
built by jesuits. Had lunch at an
Italian fender there & came back in
less than 2 hours. We called at station
to get tickets but not open.

Met Mr & Mrs Clark at San Ignacio.
We then went to Jesuit station where
the Professor showed us around. Very
interesting. — 1106-21

Hotel Grand Central Villa Rica. Saturday

Windy strong ^{strong} N. warmest day had
yet. Got up at 4 am & got on
train for Concepcion (Villa Rica) at 5:30
& arrived at Villa Rica at 3 P.M.
about 30 tourists who were at Iguazu
also. Good deal of open country with
seems hard grass for cattle which were
poor. An Englishman on train says good
cattle worth about \$200 per head.

 150 tons of cane a day which gives
 about 4% sugar. Had a cocktail
 at La Solano. After seeing we took
 the 2:30 train for Asuncion arriv-
 ing at 6:30. We tried first at

Hotel Oriental, but being no room
 we came here. Not very good & had
 no room, but place seems crowded.
 Very pretty country from P. Rico to
 about 2 hours from here, & nicely
 coloured dressed girls at view at

Asuncion Hotel Espano Americano.

Very hot last night & mosquito. Had
 to sleep. Today 35° .

I have cabin 49 along side of Side
wheel, but the Commission offers as another
cabin (43) in case many passengers

Shaw who is working on line from
Formosa to Embocacion came on
board at Formosa. A young man

named Campbell got off at Formosa. He
has camp of his own & also manages
Estancia. He gave us quite a lot of

Thursday. St. George's on way to Rosario.
We passed Comodoro at 7 am & took on
lots of oranges at different ports so
we are late & expect to get to Rosario

the Ford agent Cisneros took us to Resaca in our
car 2 PM Zapalla 6.³⁰ to French station.

Roads dry & bumpy in places. Met Erea here.
To barber. Vargas Gomez the escribano not at home.

Sept 28 Fridas

On train to Rosaris. Left on 6.³⁴ train, quite a
good fresh day. Dispatched bag with saddle
& a box of cactus by encom. to Rosaris (found
when arrived in Rosaris tomorrow that only the saddle
had been dispatched. Station master promised to
get it for us.

29 Saturdays 3 days

Fine cool day. E. arrived in Rosaris & took 7.³⁰
train to C de G. where Martin awaited for us in
Huf. Weather while we were away was very variable
cool, little sun & slight rains. Linseed looking well
may not rip yet. Grass coming in slowly. No
locust yet.
