Surplice, walked out and asked for a bid (so  
crowded was the mart we were unable to catch  
sight of bidders); 20,000 paper dollars was  
shouted; 30,000 before he had time to finish,  
50,000 followed quickly, 55,000 immediately  
afterwards, and so on till bids reached 78,000,  
when it was knocked down to Roberto Sou-  
venir (Hoewel). No other horse fetched so  
high a figure, but the average price \$43,111<sup>m</sup>/<sub>c</sub>  
for the nine colts was good, but should have  
been better. After champagne and sand-  
wiches were handed round, the fillies were  
put up for 2 years' hire. Sweetheart was the  
first walked out, and the auctioneer in a still  
more mellifluous voice asked for a bid; 40,000  
was offered, followed by 50, 60, 70, 80, 90,  
and 100 was rapidly reached. At this point  
there was a lull, but the final bid reached 121,000  
\$m/c, and she was knocked down to Mr Hoewel.  
None of the other fillies came near this price  
and the total for the 9 was \$255,000 m/c, be-  
ing an average of 28,333, rather low for such  
magnificent looking animals. The whole lot  
were the finest animals that ever Mr Bullrich  
sold, and when we consider the fame which  
the Kemmis stud has earned for itself we be-  
lieve that every colt and filly should have  
fetched at least an average of \$50,000 m/c.  
The year 1885 will see all these animals run-  
ning, and we will not be far wrong in stating  
that they will run in the places which Di-  
chosa, Souvenir, Waxy, etc., etc. have taken  
this year. We must offer our congratulations  
to Mr Kemmis, Mr Bullrich, and, though last  
not least the lucky buyers of the horses to-

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areas have, strange to  
say, given a great impetus to Rosario  
business, since the farmers and colo-  
nists who have large growing crops  
are buying more agricultural machines  
than ever, through the apprehension  
that hands will be scarcer than ever

in time. We have no figures to give

and left for the young 'lino,' which  
threatens to beat the wheat crop in  
quantity and in value. Maize is neglect-  
ed and very little sown, there is still a  
large quantity of old maize on sale in  
Rosario, but the shipments, we under-  
stand, have given poor results, and un-  
til the maize is kiln dried before ship-  
ment the export trade of the article is  
uncertain. Mr. Tappan, we hear, has  
got out splendid machines for drying  
maize, which may help the cause, but  
as yet this trade is in its infancy and  
the rude method of shipping maize  
Europe in the steamers must be reform-
