PRINCIPAL POST OFFICE CHARGES

INLAND

Letters.—3c. for first oz., and 2c. each additional oz. or fraction. Local delivery, 2c. for first oz., and 1c. each additional oz. or fraction. Special delivery, 10c., in addition to postage.

Legal and Commercial Papers and other partly printed and partly written matter.—Letter rates up to 16 oz.; thereafter 1c. per oz. or fraction.

Post Cards.—Single, 2c.; reply, 2c.

Newspapers and Periodicals.—Posted by publishers (a) to regular subscribers, 1c. 1½c. per lb.; (b) sample copies, 2c. per lb. Posted by private individuals, 1c. per 4 oz.

Books, Circulars, Drawings, Photographs, &c.—1c. per 2 oz. Limits: weight, 5 lb.; a single book, 11 lb.

Parcels.—Merchandise, Seeds, Roots, Cuttings, &c.:—To any Post Office within twenty miles, irrespective of Provincial boundaries: 1 lb., 5c.; 2 lb., 6c.; 3 lb., 7c.; 4 lb., 8c.; 5 lb., 10c.; and so on. Beyond twenty miles but within Province: 1 lb., 10c.; 2 lb., 12c.; 3 lb., 20c.; 4 lb., 25c.; 5 lb., 30c.; and so on. Beyond twenty miles and outside Province, increased rates are in force. Limit of weight, 11 lb.

Cash on Delivery.—Mail matter posted at a Money Order Post Office in Canada for delivery at any Post Office within Canada or on any rural route within Canada may be sent by this service whereby charges due to the sender up to \$100 may be collected from the addressee and remitted to the sender by Post Office Money Order. Scale of fees: 15c. for collections not exceeding \$50; 30c. for collections exceeding

\$50 and not exceeding \$100. The fee is additional to the ordinary postage.

Samples (bona fide trade samples without saleable value and not over 1 lb.).—1c. per 2 oz.

Registration Fee (on all articles except parcels).—10c., in addition to postage, covering \$25; 20c., \$50; 30c., \$75; 40c., \$100.

Acknowledgment of Receipt (for registered articles).—10c., in addition to postage and registration fee, if requested at time of posting; 20c. if requested afterwards.

Insurance of Parcels.—Parcels posted in Canada for delivery in Canada are accepted for insurance up to \$100 against loss, rifling, or damage. They may be insured up to \$50 without insurance fee, if so requested by the sender. If insurance in excess of \$50 is desired, a fee of 12c. must be prepaid.

Mail Matter other than that prepaid at letter rate must be open to inspection and, with certain specified exceptions, must contain no writing.

Money Orders are issued in Canada for payment in Canada, Antigua, Bahamas, Barbados, Bermuda, Jamaica, Newfoundland, Trinidad, and some other places at the following rates (including the 3c. tax):—

Letters.—Great Britain and all places within the Empire, France, Spain, the United States, and all other places in North and South America: 3c. for first oz., and 2c. each additional oz. Other countries: 5c. for first oz., and 3c. each additional oz.

Post Cards.—British Empire, France, Spain, and North and South America: 2c. each. Other countries: 3c. each.

Empire Air Mail Scheme.—All first class Air Mail for Aden, Australia, Burma, Ceylon, Egypt, Hong Kong, India, Kenya Colony, Malaya, Mauritius, New Zealand, Rhodesia, South Africa, Tanganyika, Uganda, and other countries formerly served under the Air Mail Scheme is accepted at the rate of 30c. each $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. which includes trans-Atlantic Air conveyance.

Printed Matter.—All countries: 1c. per 2 oz.

Blind Literature.—United States, Mexico, and Newfoundland: free. All other countries: 1c. per 4 lb.

Commercial Papers.—All countries: 5c. for first 10 oz., and 1c. for each additional 2 oz.

Samples.—United States and Mexico: 1c. per 2 oz. All other countries: 2c. for first 4 oz., and 1c. for each additional 2 oz.

Registration Fee (on all articles except parcels).—10c., in addition to postage.

International Reply Coupons, for prepayment of replies to letters, can be purchased for 12c. each; Imperial Reply Coupons, 5c. each.

Parcels.—Great Britain and Northern Ireland: 1 lb., 24c., and 18c. each lb. up to 10 lb.; over 10 lb. and up to 15 lb., \$2.50c.; over 15 lb. and up to 20 lb., \$3. Newfoundland: 12c. per lb. up to 10 lb.; over 10 lb. and up to 15 lb., \$1.50c.; over 15 lb. and up to 20 lb., \$2. United States: 14c. per lb., up to 10 lb.; over 10 lb. and up to 15 lb., \$1.75c. Mexico: 1 lb. 25c. and 15c. each lb. extra up to 10 lb.; over 10 lb. and up to 15 lb., \$2.25c.; over 15 lb. and up to 20 lb., \$3.00c. Customs Declaration of Contents and Value must be made at Post Office.

Insurance of Parcels.—The Rates for insurance of parcels sent to the United States are: 3c. for \$5; 6c. for \$25; 12c. for \$50; 30c. for \$100. To other Countries: 12c. for \$50; 30c. for \$100.

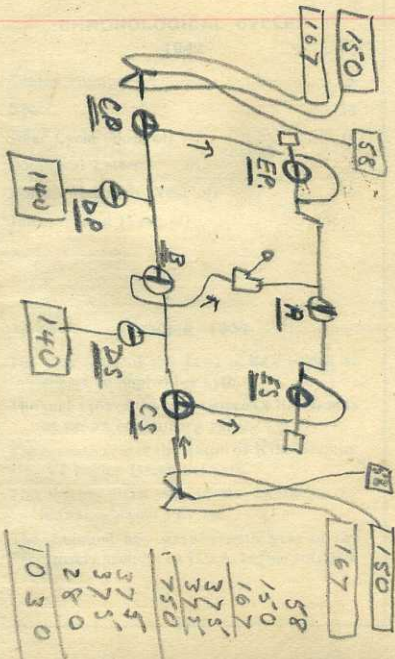
