Caught up a load of alfalfa hay. for the pigs.

Sent the second instalment of \$25 of government loan to Dickinson

3 FRIDAY [93-272]

Beautiful day. All hands mending up house pasture fence. Marcell attacking new house inside. Starting blacksmithing.

Slaughtered an old horse for the pigs.

Marcell and Salter riding the young horses.

4 SATURDAY [94-271]

Fine weather. men still working on the pasture fences. Caught up the two flocks and parted out the rams. twelve heads one in mining. Slaughtered an old sheep.

5 LOW SUNDAY [95-270]

Dividends due at Bank

Beautiful day. Played golf at Las Lomas. Mother, Mr. Marston and Mr. Hendley went over too. a mestizo heifer at the Tykes broke its leg. Slaughtered it for the Tykes.

Old Lady Day

Beautiful weather. Sent Herman to Moto de Oca to enquire the price of apachilla.

Rons took down part of the old collection fence, and put in more posts and set up the wire wires. reported the rents that went back among the men. Mr. Robinson was here over night, on his way to the Refugio.

Herman went to the station in the evening.

7 TUESDAY [97-268]

Easter Law Sittings begin

Warm day. sent Hart to Moto de Oca to fetch apachilla. brought 37 and 3 bags han. apachilla at 5.50 & the 100 R. Robinson was here over night. laid out fence in front of Quinta and garden. began to plant posts and take down old Quinta fence.

Watched a cow.

Herman and Mr. Huddley went over to Los Rosas.

Blacksmith from station here putting up the door and windows on the new rooms.

The traps locked in over night.

8 WEDNESDAY [98-267]

S 57 P.M.

This day, finished planting posts and began to get wire ready and bore post holes. finished taking down old fence. Apachita still sawing. finished the pieces he has been working on. 30 &

Dogs killed two sheep at Tyas. Herman killed the dogs.

The greyhounds caught a deer a young buck in the old colony. brought it home alive.

Sent for three quintals of rice to Piquet.

Fire Insurance Days of Grace expire

Very day. Boys all putting wires on new Quinta fence. made a bridge over the ditch on the new road.. of 4. 2 inch boards and a lot of broken posts. covered it with earth.

Just Sabatino was here. sold him the Plaza morillo. 450 head at 30.00 apiece has until the end of June to take away in. is to pay for them as he takes made a bolleto with him.

A sheep died at the Paganas pasture.

little Willie died. (Fox terrier)

Broke in a new horse to alforre seeden
Cylinder broke at the Tyres.

10 FRIDAY [100-265]

Ramadan or Turkish Lent begins

Castap mended cylinder at Tyres.

Men finished the fence. marked out the holes for putting more posts on the east fence of the Quinta and pony pasture. which is all to be taken down and made over.

Mother and Miss Norton and Donald drove to Laramie and back. men brought up Sina de rara.

Changed the Plaza morillo from 16.1 to 16.3 Tyres pasture brought up from 16.2 to 16.3 morillo D and put them into the paganas pasture.

Butchered a raccoon. bought up a load of hay.

Seebo a man to obtain arrived.

Beattyfield weather. broke in a new horse to alforre seeden

11 SATURDAY [101-264]

Warm day. brought up the pasture from the Tyres. parted the into the stable and handled them.

Boys scattering posts. and doing various. and cleaning up around the brick kilns.

Received a bundle of tanned wild animals skins.

12 SUNDAY -2 aft Easter [102-265]

Cloudy day looks like rain. played polo at Los Lomas.

J. Sabatino has paid 150.00 million paid in for about \$4,500 short in coal over night. found blacksmiths are at station. bought J. Withballs sawing machine 100.00 cut out for it. gave Sabatino a feeder to recollect as home with.

It was a fine warm day. We are still at work at the fence around the quinta. We butchered a chaco novillo. We have left for Tucuman Tristaf and Cesia and others Garcia and Jose and Panta Cheviro worked half a day and all the rest work the hole day long. Asaceta got the Alfalfa raver out of order. Tristaf mended it again.

14 TUESDAY [104-261]

It was a fine day it was warm weather. Herman went over to the station to see about some wire for the fence. Garcia went with cart to the Rosario town. All hands hard at work at fence. This afternoon sent Garcia and Panta to fix the stock fence and also bring a big load of hay. Bartolito's Ramon brought the cattle there 245 head in all. He bought a capon from us. We put the stallion into the small potros.

15 WEDNESDAY [105-260]

This morning it was very warm and cloudy. Herman and Bartolito brought up about forty horses out of the Alfalfa. They all belong to the town. So we shut them into the corral and let the cornicario know he sent a soldier for them. Poem still at work at the fence. This afternoon the poem worked till three o'clock for it rained hard. We butchered a cow. The masons are working very slowly at the new house.

2 1st 40th A.M.

This morning it rained hard.

And the poem could not work. Mother and the servant girls worked a little in the garden. Herman took Garcia with cart and got five kistats of wire and ten turnekets.

Atrops is sleeping here the night.

This morning it is still cloudy and it is drizzling hard poem could not work at the fence. Herman went to the cigar.

Set Chefa and Strillers at work in the garden half a day.

Atrops is sleeping here the night. Herman is on well this evening.

It was cloudy but did not rain. We set the poem at fencing again. We butchered two calves.

Snackta sowed Alfalfa the hole day long.

Gustaf went to the cigar and mended the shute. brought up a big load of alfa.

Andrey worked at the well in big potters.

It was a fine day. Axelius brother brought fifteen horses for us. He took Herman horse to the fiftynine. Herman went on a ride by Berlinge. Mother and Miss Mann took went out walking.

It was a little cloudy. Herman set poem to bring up some more Alfa. Herman and Arlene went to the station to get some more sand and kalk. We also got some more wire to finish the fence. We butchered to capon yesterday before worked half day.

Garcia did not work. Analletta did not work. We butchered a vacillacion.

Herman got two more boards to make some buckets. Sora and Loreto came Mr. Wash sent over for his reader

21 TUESDAY [111-254]

It was a foggy morning. Set benvio and you at mending the fence on north side. Herman and Sora went over to Station with Arlene with cart and got four big bags of flour. And four bags of sand and one of kalk. The larger girls came on a visit a stoped the night here. Herman set poem at filling up around the berbeador by the poser house.

Mother drove the laderer over to the Rosar taur. Andrez got finished with putting earth to the berbeador.

Received 162 head of cattle from Nach D put them into No 2.

Beautiful weather. dipped the sheep also the morn.
counted the sheep 1091 head.

few hours finished mending south fence on colony side.
three men making wine nothing out of No 13 vine for a garden
fence. three men planting the pots for garden fence.
masons whitewashing and putting new floor into meat hawer.
hauled up a cart load of sacks.

Son arrived from the 5th with his mares. what time into corral.
filled an old base for the pigs and geese.

25 SATURDAY [115-250]

St. Mark, Evan.

Fine day. men finished making wine nothing and putting
it up. finished the pasture. turned the ostriches into it.
Hauled up a load of hay. Slaughtered and old cow Remmies work.
Mason whitewashing. Son 3rd here with his mares.
Bohlings came over. brought his Trebol and children over.
Mr Hall child and son also nurse arrived. stay on a visit.
trapa shut in over ~~26~~ SUNDAY—4 aft Easter [116-249] night. Set as a cow
from the Trebol.

Fine weather. like spring

Beautifull day. took up both gates of the big canal and set one gate on the north side, and filled up the other gaps with thin posts. cut a load of green alfa for the jiggs. Sutched the cow that the tiperas brought.

Johnie played polo at La Lomita in the afternoon.
Mother and Mr. Watt drove over.

Started Coyote digging wells in new camp. pay him for wells & raras in diameter (round) 7.00 the rara in depth and double that in the water, and 15.00 for putting in the dead.

28 TUESDAY [118-247]

Fool morning nearly froze. Brought up the hereras and marked the calves twenty one in all. left the tortos entire and put them into the stock pens and separated the embras to take to the Tiperas.

The herera hills and one of the rams brought from Dickinson are sick. older than both with black and red scraught. Calisto and Cecilio both handling the young horses.

Took up the slack gate on the road to Dimmitown.
Hauled bricks to the well that coyote is digging.

29 WEDNESDAY [119-246]

Fine day. castrated all the bull calves among the new cattle at the Tipera and brought 18 head up, and put them into the stock pens to kill. Took 7 vacillas marked yesterday to the Tipera to pasture. 164.

The thorough good bull I died
hauling bricks to the new wells. Hauled up a load of hay.
Mr. Dickinson drove over in the afternoon
Donald came back from Rosario.
The post arrived at the station.

Beautiful weather. Sent three carts to fetch the posts from the station. paid the freight bill \$14.40/- for each mager for 7 wagon - 1486.80/-
Butchered an old ox traded from a colonist for a novitius, very fat.
cut up to hide also the hide of the bull. and made two long pointed
ropes for wells.

Son left, sent him \$1.00/- on ac. of the interest on the money.
also sent Beta Trumpet 50.00/- to help him out of difficulties.
Son left two men and a pato here lame. Took them to Sosa.
Carts made two trips, gathering up the posts, in the patio.
Calisto and Manuel and Cecilio working with young horses.
Young Mr Watt arrived, to take Mrs Watt away to morrow.

1 May FRIDAY [121-244]
St. Philip and St. James, App. and M.
C 1st 11th P.M.

Mother went to Rosario, shopping. Brought up the capons and
abacateira came and paid 250 and sent them to Rosario.
he pays 4.50/- apiece for them = 1.260. \$.

Mrs Watt went back to the San Jaches.

Carts made two trips with posts. 6 loads 3 hundred posts.
hauled more brick to the mill.

Sent to La Lomos for certificate for capons.

counted the capons left. 134. dipped them.

Frost this morning. the first one this year.
cart made two trips with posts.
The sheep are lambing very fast.
marked out two new wells for Egypto to dig
Hauled up a load of dry hay.
Hennan drove to the station to meet Mr Hall but
he did not arrive.
Sutchered a cow, poor denting.
Paid Pilar his yearly salary.
sent house cart to the station to fetch 2 bags sand one bag
lime. 4 one inch boards. and two white wash bushes.

6 WEDNESDAY [126-239]

St. John, Evan.

Strong north wind all day, getting warm again.
Cart made two trips, finished carting all the posts.
Brought up the sheep from the Tyres,
a tyre locked in for the night.
Hennan again went to meet Hall. but he did not arrive.
Gustaf blacksmithing.
killed an old hen for the pigs.

Ascension Day. Holy Thursday

Quite a warm day. parted out the sheep that we want to keep and sent the rest 450 head belonging to Sabatina to the priests. to be left there until he sends for them.

Slaughtered a cow and a sheep.

Dug up one of the big silver nattle trees that the beasts killed. Gustaf Blacksmithing.

sent to the Tyres for a load of lava de vaca.

M Schultz and another gentleman from the Germania were here for tea.

a sheep died in pigianus potro.

8 FRIDAY [128-237]

• 10th A.M.

Warm sultry day. Herman and four men went to the Tyres, and put posts (2) alongside of broken and bent ones on the fence. and took a big post down and put it in place of one of the broken posts that was too short and always loose. Dipped the sheep recently bought. 617 ewe and 11 capons. took the ones to the Tyres and the eleven capons put among our own. M Marul and gente passed on the way to Cadoba to fetch cattle. A tupa locked in for the night.

9 SATURDAY [129-236]

Half Quarter Day

Cart (three or four) hauled bricks to one of the new wells. Sabatina sent for his sheep delivered to him 1457 head. At noon a very sudden storm came up and it rained and haled awfully. the hail knocked all the wings and bops off of the trees and broke windows and destroyed all the vegetables.

the hail lay in great heaps all over the place until late at night, Slaughtered ^{10th con} _{Ascension} 1000 steers took into pig pens. Masons finished their work. paid them off.

Very cold morning. south wind all day.

Brought up the top of the stock in the pony paddock, it had blown off. put it into the stable.

Herman went to meet mother. but she telegraphed that she had missed the train.

It was a cold day. Johnie went into Rosario to get wire for fencing. Charles and Jose and Sepa and Avelino are still carting bricks to the new well. Charles did not work.

Panata worked half day.

Panta and Sepa brought up a big load of hay. Herman went over to station to meet Mother in big carriage.

Herman fixed the bucket in big potters
Butchered a cow.

12 TUESDAY [132-233]

This morning it was very cold and a heavy frost. Herman went to the Tijazar to see how things were. And brought up two well ropes to mend the one in big potters. The cart got finished carting bricks. This afternoon Herman sent Gustaf with horse cart to the station the cook went along.

We also sent Sepa and Jose with a cart to the station to get the fifty roller wire that have arrived,

Avelino's brother came this evening late with the mule.

13 WEDNESDAY [133-232]

Old May Day

Johnie came back from Rosario this morning.	
He bought at Chico some hardware to the amount \$64.00	
" at F. Woods, his 150 Quintals wire @ 9.25	1387.50
" 750 Tonquitos @ 29 $\frac{1}{2}$	217.50
" Van Oppen lumber @ 15.5 - 100 pi.	813.87

Fine day, north wind. Herman rode to Armstrong to see the carpenter that worked here two years ago.

John Donald and Anaelita marked out 1 legue of holes - for fencening a lane along the Tijeras fence, the road from Armstrong to Las Rosas station.

Brown fixing up carts and working about the place. brought up the potos from the Tijeras, and caught up the potos to town.

Slaughtered a cow.

Mr Ripley had breakfast here.

Sent carriage to the station to fetch Mr Hall,

15 FRIDAY [135-230]
Easter Law Sittings end. Scotch Quarter Day.
Oxford Easter Term ends. 3rd 4th P.M.

Foggy morning. sent the three bullock carts to the station and brought over 1500 vaillas wooden, in three loads - and in the afternoon three loads of lumber.

Sent Gustaf with cart and four horses to Montes de Oro
bought 50 bags flour @ 6.00\$ to 100 k.

Sent a man at boring the vaillas holes. bored 45 in the afternoon.

Mr Hall left for the 5th. Mr Ripley was here, received from him 100\$ for the two big horses sold, minus 10\$ com.

Burros digging just holes, pay him 3 cents the hole.

Donald provided caranchos with meat and strichnine.

16 SATURDAY [136-229]
Oxford Trinity Term begins

Warm day, cloudy, north wind. carts made two trips to the station, Jose Kartap boring vaillas. Burros digging holes. Sent horse cart to the station to fetch a panader. but he did not come, but brought his box and bed.

Sent a load of green styro for the pigs.

Slaughtered a cow.

17 Whit SUNDAY [137-228]
Pentecost. Ember Week

North wind, warm. played polo at Las Lomas.

Slaughtered a cow. the sheep died.

Warm day north wind. began to work on the fence. men all went down in horse cart. took tools for tent cooking utensils. barrel meat meat. and a loaded box with canna and raton and biscuits. Homan took his bed along will sleep there. Took three or cart loads of posts down. Two men setting posts, two digging and two boring holes. and one cooking.

A sheep died in south pasture. and one of the rams lately caught from Dickinson. it had been sick a long while. Joe bared mallets to day.

19 Whit TUESDAY [139-226]
Holiday at Law Offices

Rained very heavy last night. no wind. beautifull rain. fine warm day. except growing like anything again. Could not set posts in the forenoon. the holes full of water. Two men boring mallets. Butchard mended broken cart. Aya sick in bed. butched a cow. Sent horse cart to Bristlethwaite for 10 bags of maize. cut a load of green hay for pigs. Sabatina will gentle her to part mallets tomorrow. Mr Dickinson and Mr Daniel came over to tea. Mr Reilly called on. a fog locked in over night.

20 WEDNESDAY [140-225]
Ember Day

Foggy nasty day, south east wind. Sabatina took away 104 one hundred and four mallets. did not pay for them, will the next time he comes up. Two men boring mallets. one man helped Butchard to mend bullock cart. straightened the axles. In the afternoon sent two or cart loads of posts to the fence. Homan and men setting posts all day. Butchard a capon gave half to Sabatina men and sent the other half to the fences. Butchard a small animal in the evening. also an old horse for the pigs. Sent to Los Lomas for certificates for mallets and sheep.

Nasty drizzling day. stung with cold wind.

Herran and men worked on fence all day.

Sent me, torquitos and vaillas down began to draw me in the afternoon.

Mr Agar and the boys arrived in big carriage, on a visit.

Switched two capons. a turp looked in over night.

22 FRIDAY [142-223]

Ember Day

Cleaved up. looks like it was going to be cold through.

Mr Agar and the boys left by train.

Sent three carts over in the afternoon. but over 1 load of 750 torquitos, and 2 loads of vaillas. 1 cart broke its pole at the bridge left the cart there.

Switched a vailla.

23 SATURDAY [143-222]

Ember Day. 0.6° 26° P.M.

North wind, cold drizzling day. All hands at the fence. brought the cart with broken pole to the house. and the two other carts brought over vaillas.

Brought up a load of hay in the afternoon.

Switched the animals in the morning.

Mr Dickson and Mr Ellin rode over in the afternoon.

Mr A. and L. Hall ^{arrived by train} ₂₄ Trinity SUNDAY [144-221] Queen Victoria born, 1819 on a shooting trip.

Beautiful Mr Hall and nephew went out shooting. Donald drove them in the big carriage.

Sent back Nouvel and four polo ponies to B. Agar. he rode them to Col Gomez. to play at Harlington on Friday. Johnnie played polo at Los Lomas in the afternoon.

Beautiful day. Mr. Hall and nephew shot all pheasants down to Rosario by the 4 o'clock train.

Salvadora sent to take away some marrillas H. delivered her 119 head.

All hands began again on the fence, sent a bullock cart load of marrillas to the fence in the morning. Sent two carts to the station in the afternoon, but 1 load of marrillas and 1 load of 50 penitols wine. Satcheted a bullock.

Don't have cart to Armstrong to fetch Schen the carpenter, it came back again in the evening.

Bishlings came over in the evening.

26 TUESDAY [146-219]

Trinity Law Sittings begin.

Cloudy nasty day. All hands at fence.

Erico finished digging holes on the land.

marked out holes for the dinner fence through the new alfalfa pasture. east and west. nearly thirty squares. Two carts went to the station. but one wine and 1 barrel tea. Took up a load of hay, and took a load of marrillas with horse cart to the fences.

Schen the carpenter began work making tables.

pay him 50.00 \$ per month

Painter painting up stable and putting in window panes. Satcheted a capon.

27 WEDNESDAY [147-218]

Cloudy nasty day. Sent a cart load of marrillas, and another of posts to the fences.

got a load of leña de vaca from the Topicas.

Took the after off of the ox carts, straightened them.

Joe bring marrillas all day.

Mother and Miss Macintosh drove to the fence and to the station.

sent carriage to Baker for galletas.

Mr. Watt and son had breakfast here.

Cloudy wet forenoon. One ewe died in south potrero. It was skinned and the meat brought up for the pigs. One mala cara horse butchered for the pigs. Two animals butchered. José and Seja bored varillas all day. Donald drove M^{rs} Johnnie to the station. He is going to Buenos Aires to play polo.

29 FRIDAY [149-216]

Cold damp day. Herman removed his tent farther along the fence. In the morning two carts went to the station for varillas, and in the afternoon three cart loads were brought over. No varillas were bored to-day. One ram cleared out, and was brought back in the afternoon. It was with the sheep in the south potrero.

30 SATURDAY [150-215]
65° 55° P.M.

Wet foggy morning. The carts were unloaded and then José and Seja bored varillas the rest of the day. Avelino and Panta took an ox-cart load of varillas down to the pences, and in the afternoon filled up the varillas. The cook left to-day. Gustaf drove him to the town, and brought back two bags of stone coal, one barrel yerba, a denijuan of cana, one box groceries, 2 cans paint, and one bag of galletas.

31 SUNDAY—1 aft Trin [151-214]

Fine day. Herman came up last night, and went back this afternoon. Butchered a cow this morning. M^{rs} Benita and Miss Macintosh drove out to the colonists in the big carriage.

Fine day. Butchered two cows in the morning. José and Seja bored varillas all day. Avelino and Panta brought up a cart load of hay. In the afternoon Avelino took ten quintals of wire down to the fences, and Panta mended a broken fence. Donald brought a parcel from the station.

2 TUESDAY [153-212]

Warm day. Avelino and Panta took meat and biscuits to the fences and brought back green alfalfa for the pigs, and then hauled brush to the peon house.

Calisto, Cecilio and José Montoya went to the Jijesas and parted out twenty cows and put them in the horse potrero. Seja bored varillas all day and José half a day.

Avelino and Panta loaded up their carts with posts and then sawed wood the rest of the day.

Donald took a demijuan of caña to Herman and then drove to the station for the mail and biscuits. A trova was locked up in the big coral over night.

3 WEDNESDAY [154-211]

Warm day, south wind. Avelino and Panta took two ox cart loads of posts to the fences, and then sawed wood the rest of the day.

Butchered a cow this morning. Seja went in the cart, and when he came back bored varillas with José. One borega died in pig man's potrero. Sent a telegram to Chieba hermanos for varnish and wrote for two dozen bits (screw). Received from Salvatierra's capatas the sum of three thousand and ninety dollars.

A trova locked in over night.

Beautiful day. Salvatierra's capatas took one hundred and eight novillos away this morning from the south potrero. Panta mended fences, and Avelino worked in the quinta. Seja and José bored varillas. Seja, in the morning, brought up two sheep from the pig man's potrero for the pigs. Butchered two cows.

5 FRIDAY [156-209]

Johnie came back from P.A. loaded the Battalion at potro all hands working at fence. sent his cart loads of material to the fencers. cut a load of green affa for the pigs. a novillo died at the fencers, also his mow. Carpenter busy making sledas. Joe boring varillas.

6 SATURDAY [157-208]

Cloudy day, but warm. Johnie drove to the station to meet his James but she did not arrive. sent horse cart to the fencers with tornequitos. Caught up the broken horses from the fencers. got up a load of affa hay. Paid railroad freight bills.

7 SUNDAY—2 aft Trin [158-207]

Began to rain in the morning, and rained steadily all day. but not cold, east wind.

Yaman drove to the station in the morning, and caught back the bull tener pups Mr. Yell sent out by uncommunicated satchel, two varillas in the morning.

Left camp at 6 a.m. and crossed the river at 7 a.m. and followed the trail through the forest until noon when we reached a small stream which we crossed and followed up the valley of another stream for about four miles when we crossed back over the first stream.

9 TUESDAY [160-205]

Spent the day in the camp.

10 WEDNESDAY [161-204]

Finished the fence of the camp (one league). moved the tent and took to the next line of fencing to do. Sabatina sent gente to pasturillis took 99 mrs & foals the horses, shut in over night.

Sent three loads of stuff (pots) to the new line of fencing. Butchered 2 small animals.

Brought over 3 cart loads of algarroba beans from the station.

Very disagreeable weather.

1891 [30 Days]

11 THURSDAY [162-203]

[11 to 14] June

St. Barnabas, Ap.

Warm foggy early day. Herman began to set posts and pull wire with his goats.

sent four cart loads of material to the fence.

Paid for the algaroba beams 93 days - @ 118 the muk. = ⁹ 212.00
Calisto got a bad kick in the jaw from a mule.

Made Salvation certificate for the 99 mukllis D. (made at Los Ranchos)
The men took away 16 muk K the last ones - but one left back as sick. They also took away 3 old bullrope out of my man's pocket. Left here tired they last time they passed down.

12 FRIDAY [163-202]

Cloudy sultry weather. Satched 2 coyotes and 2 rascillas,
Carpenter working on the tables.

Sort of blacksmithing. An Italian from cutting bolts.
Hermann men fencing all day.

1 person cutting wire for tying on rascillas.

2 or 3 carts scattering posts and rascillas all day.

A cow of Mr. Markes I sliced at the Tyres.

13 SATURDAY [164-201]

Cloudy day again, but warm. Johnie and Mr. James and their children and governess at station they come on a visit.

Took two hundred gates and set them up on the new fence.

14 SUNDAY—3 aft Trin [165-200]

3rd 3rd P.M.

Cleared up at last. Hoorah! sun shone all day.

Boltingks came over in the afternoon.

Gave the carpenters of the Tyres four more horses for the work there.

Foggy in the morning. but cleared up into a fine day with wind.

All hands again at the fence. buried the new fence. pay the fencing peons \$1⁵⁰ to the day. one gallo and a tot. Sent three carts made two trips from station with vanillas. Market out thirty square of pot holes along the west side of R.R. line. bushes digging holes.

Butchered two small animals.

Joe Aguirre was here in the afternoon.

Sent horse cart to the station for the cook who came back again. Joe bring vanillas all day.

16 TUESDAY [167-198]

Fine sunny days. but big heavy clouds hanging about. Mr. R. Díaz the Rosario R.R. government inspector come out and visited his house in the camp. he comes to make inquiries about the fencing of the R.R. through our land. he went away again in the afternoon.

Sent some vanillas to the ~~peones~~, in the horse cart. The ladies drove out in the afternoon.

Killed an old horse. (pairo charia) for the pigs. Paid the freight on the last load of vanillas \$150.50

17 WEDNESDAY [168-197]

Beautiful day sunny. but heavy clouds hanging about. Brought up the peons from the Typos. caught up one for Cecilio to turn. and one to give to Adolfo Lawrence. Getting along pretty fast with the fence. changed the encampment.

Butchered two animals.

Sent three of carts to the station for wood, a wagon load wood for us from Bolster in Laredo.

Mother and ladies drove to the Typos.

Mr. Norman shall have for the night.

Joe bring vanillas every day.

Rained quite hard last night. Thundered a lot. Got cleared up fine in the morning. and was a fine sunny day. Set up a gate opposite the gate going into the Typos camp. on the lane. Boktingh sent over a cart with 4 bags of maize for us, and took away 130 ruillas sold them at 35 cent. — 45.51 also 14 bags of alfalfa seed weighing .601 K @ 5.00 the 10K.

19 FRIDAY [170-195]

Clouded up and got very cold last night. But in the morning it cleared up and rained a little nearly all day. finished the division fence. scattered three or four loads of posts along the line along the R.R. Butchered two animals, and a sucking pig. but have sent to the station for gallito, caña, and an emuenda. a sheep died in south pasture No 1 flock.

20 SATURDAY [171-194]
Accession of Queen Victoria, 1837

Clouded up last night, with a strong south wind very cold day. Turned the tent to the south end of line along the R.R. and recovered and mended up the whole of the old south fence 30 squares and made one square near the line entirely over. putting in more posts. Fort ball scratch a Los Lomos. all our folks attended except Johnie and ^{Miss} ~~Johnie~~ Placencia.

21 SUNDAY — 4 aft Trin [172-193]
Summer commences 12th (noon)

Beautiful day. frog heard in the morning. Mother and Mrs. Johnie came to La Rosas. Johnie played polo at Los Lomos. dogs killed two sheep last night. Butchered two animals.

O 5° 12^m A.M.

Cold morning, but beautifull day.

Hannan and all his men began on the fence along the R.R. between men.

Mr. Janner left in the afternoon.

Hauled yellets and strants and logs for beebles, in the bullock carts. to the north well in the new pastures. Sent some horses to rest, in No 3 pasture at the Tipis.

23 TUESDAY [174-191]

Fine day cool and sunny. Hauled two oxcart loads with 6 beebles to the well in the morning, and one with 8 in the afternoon, and one load of posts scattered along the line.

Changed the encampment. Took vailler down in horse cart. Satched two animals.

Adolfo looked in a traps over night. anticipated him his photo.

24 WEDNESDAY [175-190]

St. John Baptist. Midsummer Day.
Quarter Day. Cambridge Easter Term ends

Beautiful day. Hauled two cart loads of posts to the fence, and two horse cart loads of sarellas.

Gastaf turned beebles and yellets at new well.

brought up a load of dry alfalfa, and a load of green alfalfa for the pigs.

Parted off animals at the Tipis, for Satchewig. put them into the horse pastures.

Donald drove to the station and brought home Mrs. Comish and two children.

Johnie rode to Caledony and back, had a selection written out by a notary, to send to the Minister of the interior to oblige the R.R. pay for the leasing.

North wind, getting warm again.

Herman getting along faster with the fence now.

Hauled down two cart loads of posts, and one of wire and turniquets, and hauled two trips of varillas with horse cart. two men driving varillas. Carpenter hauled the bobinas again. Laid out the lands with single plough for ploughing in the new Quinta. Slaughtered two animals.

Mrs Dickson here for tea. Mr Comte, Mr Montalb and Moggié went out riding in the evening.

Received receipt from Santiago for the varilla chique sent 2,250 \$ sent a letter for the wagon more of posts.

26 FRIDAY [177-188]

North wind, but cool.

Set up a hurdle gate with lock, in the Tres Leguas corner. killed an old mare for the pigs.

Dog killed a lamb and a ewe in the big pasture.

Horse cart scattering varillas, as fast as the men could bear them.

finished marking out the lots along the line as far as the end of the camp, and then marked out on the east side of river, and south side of little paddock.

Carpenter putting together another set of bobs.

Ladies went out riding in the evening.

27 SATURDAY [178-187]

North wind, getting warmer. Mr Ishwood here for the night.

One or east made three trips scattering posts along the line. also hauled turniquets and wire there.

Slaughtered two animals. Set up a load of dry alfalfa.

Began to cut off of the stock back of the galpon.

Mrs Chute came out by the morning train. but went back again in the evening, also ^{28 SUNDAY—5 att Trin [179-186]} Mr Comte and children.

Coronation of Queen Victoria, 1838.

11th 10th P.M.

Strong north wind, quite warm. Played polo at Los Lomos.

St. Peter, Apos.

Very close warm day, cloudy. All hands began at the fence again! Hauling down varillas and wire. Two men boring varillas.

Donald and a few went to Los Lomos. looked through their south flock of sheep. but did not find any of our lost sheep! Two animals.

A. trip of 2000 head of cattle very thirsty, gave water to them at pig man's petro well. in stock pasture well and south pasture well. and dried up all the wells. but gave water except. round in the camp tonight.

Sent Balstro to the hands with solicited. to get signatures.

30 TUESDAY [181-184]

Quarter Sessions Week

Wind changed. and in the afternoon it rained hard from the north. could not work.

Tropa passed by. on the way north.

Johnie took mess of tropa to the Rosas.

M. Hall here for breakfast.

Special train passed with Mr. Fisher and Mr. Craig the man that is to take Mr. Fisher's place as manager.

1 July WEDNESDAY [182-183]

Cleared up nicely last night. but it was a nasty foggy cold morning. fences began to fence on the east side of the R.R. from Lummie fence this way. hauled down posts with horse cart.

Two men boring varillas.
