Very hot day with north wind. Balderson ofenrocks.
Brought up tools and moved encampment to the north
potrero.

in north potrero for the dogs.

We received forty three bags of wheat.

I look stormy in the north.

We got another barrel of beer.

It was a warm day and it was very windy, it looks
stormy. We butchered a big cow. the dogs killed
four sheep last night. Herman received
fourtyone bags of wheat from pigman.
Cofa cut trees for fire wood. Panta and Avila
cut abaya in potrero.

(9th 15th M.M.)

It was a cloudy day. Herman and Min Mac
intosh went down to the Tajar everything
is all right. The alfa poera would not
work today.

It was a fine morning. Salva Teras
poem took a Tropa Heaver. 93 and one calf
We butchered three calves.
Hermann took the two ox carts to receive
wheat we got 69 bags.
Ostrackio Ramon was here.
The alfa poem finished one stack
In the afternoon we sent ox carts
with wheat to the station.
The ox carts brought one barrel of corn
two bags flower and sack salt.

23 TUESDAY [54-512]

It was a warm cloudy day. Hermann went
over to the town and got a well rope and
baskets for water fillingsman.
sent two ox carts with wheat to town.
We cured 20 animals.
In afternoon took the ox carts and got
54 bags of wheat.

24 WEDNESDAY [55-511]
St. Matthias, Ap.

It was a very warm day. Hermann
went alover camp. We butchered three calves
sent carts with wheat over to Bothlingke
calpon. Hermann received 24 bags of
wheat. We cured several animals.
Carlitos went over to town with out per
mission.

With much nice day. no work done.
 brought up *Myiophis manada* to cure a more
 also. brega flock to our maggots.
 killed a brega that was too far gone to use
 and killed a capon to eat.
 butchered a fat bullock traded from colonist
 for a novillio.
 Miss Agnes Macintosh left for Rosario.
 Miss Brattle was here for breakfast.
 M. Borthwick and his book keeper called on.

Fine cool day. Now began at sticking again.
 butchers looking for cattle. one here.

2 Ash WEDNESDAY [62-304]

First Day of Lent

No to mind, looks like rain. hope it does
 cured a lot of animals of maggots.
 cut up the bullock hide. well rope
 Received wheat from colonist.

North wind, stormy air, cloudy, could not work in the afflas. Patrick laid at 74 the egg today. Parted out nineteen novillon from the Texas, took to butcher and two to house for bullcock and one to trade to Raymond for a fat bullcock, also brought up from the Texas clean novillions took them to Pelass pasture. Brought up the potros from the Texas, put them into No 7 and the potrancas from No 7 into No 4 where the potros were. Received wheat and sent the 2 cart loads to the station. Alfalfa coming to hand in the potros.

4 FRIDAY [64-302]

Sold the wheat to Bottling @ \$10.20 the 100 R. 1255 bags weighed it 77206 lbs. = \$7875.00 Bottling paid to P. Lammie to our ac. \$1,000. and gave us a cheque on Fallowfield for \$8,000 Received 15% charge from Piguet Lammie. Very heavy storm last night, rained little, but blew hard. Salvaterra called on. Opened all the affla piles to dry. Three sheep died No 1 flock. Cured a lot of sick animals.

5 SATURDAY [65-301]

Ember Week

It was a fine day. Sabine played polo over at La Loma. Salva Thieran from took a trophy of cows 82 cows and 46 calves. We butchered a novillon.

It was a fine day. Herman received wheat
Sija went with ox cart we received 81 bag of
wheat. Mammel and cured five animals
It is getting cloudy Donald and Eids
went out in camp.
The new cookwoman came this evening

It rained hard early in the morning.
Herman went over to the station to meet Mr.

a novillo in afternoon Herman and Mr
Spangler went to receive wheat.

here on a visit. Sails was in prison
We butchered a capon from the Tizaras.

9 WEDNESDAY [69-997]

Ember Day

It was a fine day Herman and Mr Spangler
went out looking after thing. Donald and
Mammel and Calisto cured ten animals
and two cows at Pelagru prieto.
sent Sija and Frylan with cart with
wheat to Bathingke calpon 140 bags.
Herman and Mr Spangler went to visit
Kemanian in the afternoon.
Mr Dickenson sent after quills to
hunt with. Sent Eids with horse
cart to station with servants.

It was a cloudy day. Herman and Mr Spangler received wheat 22 bags. Saja mended the calpon floor.

Donald and Manuel and Balitro cured sheep 28 small. In afternoon Manuel and Balitro cured a mare. Panta came back and cut down trees.

We put in the damp wheat into the calpon. Alfa palms did not work to day. The alfa is to green.

11 FRIDAY [71-295]

Ember Day

It was a fine day. Herman and Mr Spangler went to receive wheat. Donald cured 14 animals.

We butchered a novillo and made a well rope. We dried some damp wheat.

Mr. Dickenson was here and brought quack back. Mother drove Mr Spangler over to the station. We gave Mr Spangler a capon and a turkey to take with him.

Mr Garland from 37 Estancia was here to dinner. Mother received 1.50 dollars from Bothlingk.

12 SATURDAY [72-294]

Ember Day

It was fine weather. Herman received wheat 400 bags. Sicillo came back with Salvatier from a tropo of cattle shut in our corral. Panta dug a big hole in the garden.

13 SUNDAY - 2 in Lent [73-293]

O 10° 55° P.M.

This morning it was fine weather it is clearing up. Herman intragured a tropo of 82 cows and 73 calves to Salva. Their capatan Sicillo is stopping here for him horse game out.

It was fine weather. Sepa worked in the garden. Panta did not ~~come~~ ^{leave} ~~bag~~ ^{bag}. We butchered a novillo. In afternoon Herman and Sepa received wheat 46 bags. Manuel made a well rope. Herman went over to town for a certificate for the calves.

15 TUESDAY [75-299]

It was a fine day. Herman and Sepa received wheat 41 bags. We sent Donald with the big carriage to meet Mr. James Ager and Mr. Patten and Mr. Grovel who are here on a visit for several days. Qualls took two cart loads of Alfa. everything is all right. cured seven animals. We brought two cattle from the Rora camp.

16 WEDNESDAY [76-299]

It was a very close day. Herman and the gentlemen went out riding down to the Tinjara a novillo died one of the chaco novillos. We sent 160 bags of wheat over to Bathelings calves. Sepa and Avileno went with carts. We butchered a novillo. We took the gentleman out shooting in big carriage. Mr. Norman Hall came to day. ^{After} ~~During~~ their evening

It was a cloudy day. ^{St. Patrick} Hermann drove the Gentlemen out in his carriage to ward the Tajarrac to shoot partridges. Sent Sefa and Avillero with carts to Bethlehem's calpan with 124 bags of wheat. In the afternoon Panta came back. Hermann took the Gentlemen over to San Rosar in his carriage. We made another well rope.

18 FRIDAY [78-288]

It commenced to rain, and rained till noon late. Hermann took Sefa and Panta with ox carts and received wheat 54 bags.

In afternoon Panta and Sefa did not work on account of the rain.

The Gentlemen went out shooting. Alfa, poens did not work.

The Gentlemen went for a ride in his spotters. Purchured a novillo. Avillero got demandard over at the town.

19 SATURDAY [79-287]

Fine cool day, cloudy weather, no work done in the alfalfa.

John came back from Sanlita, did not buy any cattle.

The Agas and rivitos went out shooting.

20 SUNDAY—3 in Lent [80-286]
Spring commences

Beautiful day. rivitos shot in the morning, and went to Lulmar in the afternoon to play polo.

(5 10th P.M.)

Beautiful weather, clouded up in the morning.
 looks like rain. mister left for Buenos Aires.
 Butchered a novillia, sent up its hide for
 wall rope.

Received a load of wheat.

Started to cut alfalfa in stack pasture.
 finished stacking in south pasture.

22 TUESDAY [82-284]

North wind warm day.

alfalfa pens and Herman made a fence
 around the stacks in south pasture.

Brought up all the mares and separated

Rained hard all night, stopped in the morning. But cloudy day, cleared up in the evening. Mr Loader and Mallett came out to shoot. could not do any work. Mr Reply passed by.

26 SATURDAY [86-280]

Cleared up, a fine day, butchered a cow. Donald went to the Defango cut up the wall's hole for a wall rope. Mr Loader and Mallett out shooting. got plow ready for plowing.

We butchered a novillo. Donald Main toh came back from Befangs. A troop of novillos were shut in our corral last night. They belong to a man by the name of Breconio Forjino. he sold his novillos to our colonists.

Fox Hunting ends

It was a cloudy day. Herman and Sija are still drying the wet wheat. Don Cresencio Forquino has sold all his animals to the colonists.

Panta did not come back yet. We made another well rope. Donald went to the station and got some things. There he went in his carriage. In afternoon Herman and Sija received 24 bags of wheat from Carlos Bolino.

1 April FRIDAY [92-274]

Indian Bonds due at Bank

It was a fine day. Herman took Cresencio Fonseca down to the Cajon to see our novillos.

Rufino and Apoteto cut out some more fawns. We butchered a novillo. Herman and Sija received wheat 46 bags.

Cresencio Fonseca went over to the Rancostown. Mr. Ripley came in afternoon.

2 SATURDAY [93-273]

It was a fine day. Herman and Sija are still drying wheat. Herman and Sija received wheat the whole day long.

Mr. Paul came over from the San Lomas and took the road first trip. Panta not come yet. every thing all right. ascan died in passing others.

3 SUNDAY—5 in Lent [94-272]

It was a nice day. Mr. Woods trasher got done trashing here also has the trasher from the Lomas they trashed for Carlos Bolino. We butchered a novillo. Rufino let the horse clear and unhooked the mowing machine.
