

half have been torn out. Coped any
with notes, and some with arithmetic
sums.

Hot dry dusty day. terrible draught cattle and sheep dying on the fine mups people moving their cattle everywhere.

Rec'd a telegram from Bull. he is in Sandstone with the 1000 now he is bringing from Juniper. Counted the cattle in No 3 pasture. 321 head cows and a few more.

Brought up all the cattle from No 2. and parted out 411 weaner calves. sent them into Rig man pasture. and the rest (yearling cattle out of P. Lewis' prairie cattle.) 447 head into the stock paddock.

Bank Holiday, Scotland. Quarter Sessions
Week. O D^o 41st P.M.

Terrible hot day. strong north wind all day. at night a big dust storm and a good shower of rain. pity not enough.

Herran and men cleaned and prepared the mill of No 6 and 7 pastures. Butchered a cow.

Two persons putting parts in place of those burnt out of the fence of Begbie fence among the trees.

Put rock bows cut No 8 and pastures (2) year old into ³ TUESDAY [3-362] horse pastures. the grazing pastures from South pasture into No 5 pasture.

Sent and parted some animals out of Herran's pastures.

Fine cool day. Herran and men cleaning and preparing well in No 2.

Butchered a cow. Took 6 scillas from No 8 to Pasture to put to hill, marked 3 with cow color. Shot up two scillas to tame. Loaded up hide.

4 WEDNESDAY [4-361]

1. Sent 119 cow hide 343 calf and 3 pasture to Hawson Hall in Burns.

Hot day.

Cattle arrived at midday. 893 scillas and 75 cattle at pasture. parted 383 scillas into No 6 pasture.

Brought up the calves, cut their feet and cleaned tails. Killed 3 hinds. Herran and men, cleaned out well in No 2 pastures.

Dividends due at Bank

Yest day. the novilllos caught in Poyano 1528 arrived at the Bajo Honda. stopped there three, and then gave them water and feed and afterwards parted out. 318 of the smallest ones were took and took them to Pilas Puerto. and then parted 236 of the next smallest and put them with 166 among the ones Cuello caught. Parted out 116 novilllos of the last batch caught and put them also into Pilas Puerto.
Butchered a cow.

Sent to Federico Roth. San Nicolas, 2 pagans, we sent to have signed. one for \$11,448.59 for 3 months dating from Dec 21/92 due March 2/93 and one dating from Dec 2/92 for 6 months due June 2/93 — for 893 now @ \$6.00 and guiss and cost of stamped paper for Pagans.

Parted at the Bajo Honda 510 of the best novilllos sent them with South Patino.

The rest of the novilllos 505 put into No 2 patio. gave them all water.

Herman took pons to load up salado alfalfa at the station. Butchered a cow. Cleaning house out of wells. ⁷ SATURDAY [7-358] Went to station and iron from Chico. Hot slow day cattle drinking a terrible lot of water. but wells do not give out. Herman loading alfalfa

and a pony for gold @ 10.

Sent 1.30. to Agua for Oliva.
Brought a cow W from Los Tuncos camp.
Sheep lambing. a great many lambs getting lost through the heat.
Rigual Train left for the mines. to take charge while B. Leon goes to the states.

5 SUNDAY—3 in Lent [64-301]

Very hot weather. sheep all lambing at once. and leaving their lambs. out after the sheep all day.
Shot up in cart 70 lambs. have a woman raining them.

Butchered a cow.

Terrific hot day. sky one cloud of dust.
 cattle drinking a great deal of water.
 Finished the division fence running N.E.
 began to take down Peter Peters fence.
 Received and sent wheat to the station.
 Sent back 1 load 185 bags alfalfa seed and another of 20 rolls galvanized wire.
 Butchered a cow. sheep giving a lot of trouble, lambing.
 Mr. Chater two sons came out on a visit.
 A butchering for the night. sent animals into
 the corral.
