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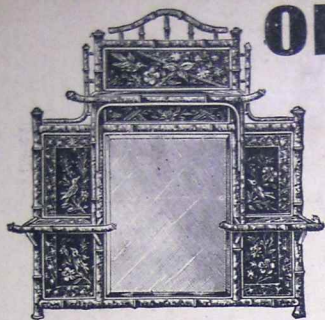

Applications for Money Orders should be made on the printed form of requisition, which can be obtained from all Post Offices, gratis. The full name and address of both Applicant and Payee must be clearly given.

Rates of Commission.—Sums not exceeding 10 Rupees, 2 Annas; sums not exceeding 25 Rupees, 4 Annas; and 4 Annas for each complete sum of 25 Rupees, and 4 Annas for the remainder. If the remainder does not exceed 10 Rupees, 2 Annas.

A Money Order must be made payable to one person only; no Money Order can be made out in favour of two or more persons.

* * The highest amount for which a Money Order can be granted is 150 Rupees. Orders must not include fractional parts of an Anna.
