REGISTRATION OF BIRTHS AND DEATHS.

BIRTHS.
 By an Act passed in 1874, it is enacted that parents must register every birth within 42 days of the date thereof, at the Registrar's Office for the District in which they reside. In default the Registrar is empowered to compel their attendance at his Office, and to charge extra fees.

DEATHS.
 Deaths must be registered within five days unless a notice with medical certificate has been sent to the Registrar. The nearest relatives of the deceased, present at death, are liable to a penalty for neglect of this regulation.
