college — I hope they can take Frank.
I have sent a copy of the Sailplane
to Daddy. It has the main account
of the Wasserkuppe meeting in it, and
describes my flights. I have written
an article for the magazine, but
haven't heard what the Editor thinks
of it. If he prints it, I will send the
Sailplane out home. A lot of people
are getting interested in gliding now,
and I think it will catch on. The
trouble is that there aren't many
starting places in England. The
only way to do it properly is to
get towed by an aeroplane, and that
is expensive.

I've got a lot of Christmas letters to
write, so must stop now.
